

Classroom Disruption



Classroom disruption is generally regarded as behavior that substantially or repeatedly interferes with the conduct of a class and the learning time of students.

Examples include:

- Persistent speaking without being recognized (*Talking out of place*)
- Loud and/or frequent interruption of class flow with inappropriate questions, remarks or noises
- Belligerent behavior once confronted (*arguing*)
- Late arrival to class
- Unauthorized use of cell phones
- Verbal and/or physical threats
